## The Resurrection

Mark 16:9 Now when Jesus was risen early the first day of the week, He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven devils.

Someone is sure to notice Mark 16:9, thinking this text says the resurrection was upon Sunday. But if you read the whole sentence, it does not say that at all. The expression "was risen" is in the perfect tense. What was Jesus' condition early the first day of the week? Does it say he "was rising" or that He "did rise" from the grave? No, early the first day of the week, at the time He appeared to Mary Magdalene, He WAS RISEN. Of course He was! He had risen the late afternoon before, so naturally He WAS RISEN Sunday morning. The text does not in any way refute the scores of other texts we have given.

## HWA, The Resurrection was NOT on Sunday

Mark 16:9 Now when Jesus was risen, early the first day of the week, He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven devils.

If Jesus was risen on Sabbath, what did He do from such a time until His first appearance to His disciples?

Why did He wait until Sunday morning to appear to the women, and to the two men on the road to Emmaus?

Why did He wait until Sunday night to reveal himself to His grieving disciples?

Why not appear to someone on Saturday night (and thereby prove His alleged 72 hour resurrection prophecy)?

The second week of the $7^{\text {th }}$ month which contains:

Day of Atonement [which is a Shabbat]
The weekly Sabbath [Shabbat]

## The Third Day

Thirteen times it was specified that the resurrection would take place on the "third day" (Mat.16:21; 17:23; 20:19; 27:64; Mark 9:31; 10:34, Luke 9:22; 13:32; 18:33; 24:7,46; Acts 10:40; 1 Cor 15:4).

Five times, it was stated "in three days" (Matthew 26:61; 27:40, Mark 15:29, John 2:19-20).

Two times, it states, "after three days" (Matthew 27:63, Mark 8:31).
One time, it states as "three days and three nights" (Matthew 12:40).

Mark 1:13 And He was there in the wilderness forty days, tempted of Satan; and was with the wild beasts; and the angels ministered unto Him.

Luke 4:2 Being forty days tempted of the devil. And in those days He did eat nothing: and when they were ended, He afterward hungered.

## But...it says days AND nights

1 Samuel 30:11-13 They found an Egyptian in the field, and brought him to David, and gave him bread, and he ate; and they gave him water to drink. They gave him a piece of a cake of figs, and two clusters of raisins: and when he had eaten, his spirit came again to him; for he had eaten no bread, nor drunk any water, three days and three nights. David said to him, To whom belong you? and whence are you? He said, I am a young man of Egypt, servant to an Amalekite; and my master left me, because three days ago I fell sick.

1 Samuel 30:14-17 We made a raid on the South of the Cherethites, and on that which belongs to Judah, and on the South of Caleb; and we burned Ziklag with fire. David said to him, Will you bring me down to this troop? He said, Swear to me by God, that you will neither kill me, nor deliver me up into the hands of my master, and I will bring you down to this troop. When he had brought him down, behold, they were spread abroad over all the ground, eating and drinking, and dancing, because of all the great spoil that they had taken out of the land of the Philistines, and out of the land of Judah. David struck them from the twilight even to the evening of the next day: and there not a man of them escaped, except four hundred young men, who rode on camels and fled.

Esther 4:16 Go, gather together all the Jews that are present in Shushan, and fast ye for me, and neither eat nor drink three days, night or day: I also and my maidens will fast likewise; and so will I go in unto the king, which is not according to the law: and if I perish, I perish. 17 So Mordecai went his way, and did according to all that Esther had commanded him. 5:1 Now it came to pass on the third day, that Esther put on her royal apparel, and stood in the inner court of the king's house, over against the king's house: and the king sat upon his royal throne in the royal house, over against the gate of the house.

Exodus 24:16-18 And the glory of the LORD abode upon mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it six days: and the seventh day He called unto Moses out of the midst of the cloud. And the sight of the glory of the LORD was like devouring fire on the top of the mount in the eyes of the children of Israel. And Moses went into the midst of the cloud, and got him up into the mount: and Moses was in the mount forty days and forty nights.

We have the expression "after three days" once (Matt. xxvii. 63), and "in three days" once (John ii. 19). But the common expression is "on the third day," and it occurs ten times. But if the expression be literal and not an idiom, all these passages should say the fourth day! Paul preached the resurrection on "the third day" according to the Scriptures (1 Cor. xv. 4), and this is the great Scriptural fact which we cannot get away from. Neither can we alter the fact that He rose on "the first day of the week." Neither can we alter the history which records His death and burial as taken place the day before the Sabbath. "The Sabbath drew on" (Luke xx111.54. Matt. xxvii. 62); "the day before the Sabbath" (Mark xv. 42)
