

Genesis 15:13–16

And he said unto Abram, Know of a surety that thy seed shall be a stranger in a land that is not theirs, and shall serve them; and they shall afflict them four hundred years; And also that nation, whom they shall serve, will I judge: and afterward shall they come out with great substance. And thou shalt go to thy fathers in peace; thou shalt be buried in a good old age. But in the **fourth generation** they shall come hither again: for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet full.

Exodus 3:7–8

And the LORD said, I have surely seen the affliction of my people which are in Egypt, and have heard their cry by reason of their taskmasters; for I know their sorrows; And I am come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land unto a good land and a large, unto a land flowing with milk and honey; unto the place of the Canaanites, and the Hittites, and the Amorites, and the Perizzites, and the Hivites, and the Jebusites.

Exodus 5:1

And afterward Moses and Aaron went in, and told Pharaoh, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Let my people go, **that they may hold a feast unto me in the wilderness**.

Exodus 8:1

And the LORD spake unto Moses, Go unto Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Let my people go, **that they may serve me**.



Exodus 13:8–10

And thou shalt shew thy son in that day, saying, This is done because of that which the LORD did unto me when I came forth out of Egypt. And it shall be for a sign unto thee upon thine hand, and for a memorial between thine eyes, that the LORD'S law may be in thy mouth: for with a strong hand hath the LORD brought thee out of **Egypt.** Thou shalt therefore keep this ordinance in his season from year to year.



Exodus 1:1–5

Now these are the names of the children of Israel, which came into Egypt; every man and his household came with Jacob. Reuben, Simeon, Levi, and Judah, Issachar, Zebulun, and Benjamin, Dan, and Naphtali, Gad, and Asher. And all the souls that came out of the loins of Jacob were seventy souls: for Joseph was in Egypt already.



Exodus 6:16 And these are the names of the **sons of Levi** according to their generations; Gershon, and **Kohath**, and Merari: and the years of the life of Levi were an hundred thirty and seven years.

Exodus 6:18 And the **sons of Kohath**; **Amram**, and Izhar, and Hebron, and Uzziel: and the years of the life of Kohath were an hundred thirty and three years.

Exodus 6:20 And **Amram** took him Jochebed his father's sister to wife; and she bare him **Aaron and Moses**: and the years of the life of Amram were an hundred and thirty and seven years.



Exodus 24:3-8[3-5]

And Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD, and all the judgments: and all the people answered with one voice, and said, All the words which the LORD hath said will we do. And Moses wrote all the words of the LORD, and rose up early in the morning, and builded an altar under the hill, and twelve pillars, according to the twelve tribes of Israel. And he sent young men of the children of Israel, which offered burnt offerings, and sacrificed peace offerings of oxen unto the LORD

Exodus 24:3-8[6-8]

And Moses took half of the blood, and put it in basons; and half of the blood he sprinkled on the altar. And he took the book of the covenant, and read in the audience of the **people**: and they said, All that the LORD hath said will we do, and be obedient. And Moses took the blood, and sprinkled it on the people, and said, Behold the **blood of the covenant**, which the LORD hath made with you concerning all these words.

Numbers 13:17–20 And Moses sent them to spy out the land of Canaan, and said unto them, Get you up this way southward, and go up into the mountain: And see the land, what it is; and the people that dwelleth therein, whether they be strong or weak, few or many; And what the land is that they dwell in, whether it be good or bad; and what cities they be that they dwell in, whether in tents, or in strong holds; And what the land is, whether it be fat or lean, whether there be wood therein, or not. And be ye of good courage, and bring of the fruit of the land. Now the time was the time of the firstripe grapes.

Numbers 13:23-27[23-25]

And they came unto the brook of Eshcol, and cut down from thence a branch with one cluster of grapes, and they bare it between two upon a staff; and they brought of the pomegranates, and of the figs. The place was called the brook Eshcol, because of the cluster of grapes which the children of Israel cut down from thence. And they returned from searching of the land after forty days.



Numbers 13:23-27[26-27]

And they went and came to Moses, and to Aaron, and to all the congregation of the children of Israel, unto the wilderness of Paran, to Kadesh; and brought back word unto them, and unto all the congregation, and shewed them the fruit of the land. And they told him, and said, We came unto the land whither thou sentest us, and surely it floweth with milk and honey; and this is the fruit of it.



Joshua 1:2b–3



Exodus 14:5–6

And it was told the king of Egypt that the people fled: and the heart of Pharaoh and of his servants was turned against the people, and they said, **Why have we done this**, that we have let Israel go from serving us? **And he made ready his chariot, and took his people with him**:



Exodus 14:10–12 And when Pharaoh drew nigh, the children of Israel lifted up their eyes, and, behold, the Egyptians marched after them; and they were sore afraid: and the children of Israel cri ut unto the LORD. And they said unto Moses, B here were no graves in Egypt, hast thou taken us aw o die in the wilderness? wherefore hast thou dealt the vith us, to carry us forth out of Egypt? Is not this the d that we did tell thee in Egypt, saying, Let us alone, 1 we may serve the Egyptians? For it had been k her for us to serve the **Egyptians**, than that we h the wilderness.

Exodus 14:15 And the LORD said unto Moses, Wherefore criest thou unto me? speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward:

Exodus 15:23–26 And when they came to Marah, they could not drink of the waters of Marah, for they were **bitter:** therefore the name of it was called Marah. And **loses**, saying, What shall the people murmured 24 RD; and the LORD we drink? And he cried shewed him a tree, which wh e had cast into the **leet:** there he made for waters, the waters were mad , and there he proved them a statute and an ordin igently hearken to the voice them, And said, If thou w of the LORD thy God, a 4+ do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear andments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the LORD that healeth thee.



Exodus 16:2–3

And the whole congregation of the children of Israel murmured aga oses and Aaron in the wilderness: And the d ren of Israel said unto them, Would to Ge e had died by the hand of the LORD in the of Egypt, when we n we did eat bread sat by the flesh pots, and to the full; for ye h nt us forth into this wilderness, to kill this whole assembly with hunger.



Exodus 16:4

Then said the LORD unto Moses, Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you: and the people shall go out and gather a certain prove them, whether to be a set of the people shall go l walk in my law, or no.

Exodus 16:27-28



Exodus 17:2–4

Wherefore the people did chide with Moses, and said, Give us water that we may drink. And Moses said unto the chide ye with me? t the LORD? And the wherefore do ye ter people thirsted the ter; and the people said, Wherefore murmured against Moses, is this that thou hast brou us up out of Egypt, d our cattle with to kill us and our cl thirst? And Moses cried unto the LORD, saying, What shall I do unto this people? they be almost ready to stone me.

Exodus 32:1-7[1-3]

And when the people saw that Moses delayed to come down out of the mount, the people gathered themselves together unto Aaron, and said unto him, Up, make us gods, which shall go before us; for as for this Moses, the man that brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we wot not what is become of him. And Aaron said unto them, Break off the golden earrings, which are in the ears of your wives, of your sons, and of your daughters, and bring them unto me. Exodus 32:1-7[4-7]

And he received them at their hand, and fashioned it with a graving tool, after he had made it a molten calf: and they sa se be thy gods, O e up out of the land of Israel, which brought Egypt. And when Aa saw it, he built an altar before it; and Aaron lamation, and said, To morrow is a feas **D. And they rose up** che nd of d burnt offerings, early on the morrov and brought peace d hd the people sat ing down to eat and to dr **rose up to play**. And the LORD said unto Moses, Go, get thee down; for thy people, which thou broughtest out of the land of Egypt, have corrupted themselves:

Numbers 11:1–3 And when the people complained, it displeased the LORD: and the LORD heard it; and his anger was kindled; and the fire of the LOR ong them, and consumed them that we the uttermost parts of the camp. And people cried unto Moses; and when Mo prayed unto the **LORD, the fire was g ched**. And he called the name of the place Taberah: because the fire of the LORD burnt among them.



Numbers 11:4–6 And the mixt multitude that was among them fell a lusting: and the children of Israel also wept again, and said, Who shall give us flesh to eat? We remember the hich we did eat in Egypt freely; the cuc d the melons, and pers, the leeks, and the on the garlick: But now our soul is dried away s nothing at all, beside this manna, /re ol les. Numbers 11:10 The ard the people weep 2000 throughout their families, every man in the door of his tent: and the anger of the LORD was kindled greatly; Moses also was displeased.



Numbers 12:1–2

And Miriam and Aaron spake against Moses man whom he had because of the Ethior married: for he had n Ethiopian arrie he LORD indeed woman. And they Hat spoken only by Mos e not spoken also by us? And the LORD hear Numbers 12:9

And the anger of the LORD was kindled against them; and he departed.



Numbers 14:1–4

And all the congregation lifted up their voice, and cried; and the people wept that night. And all the

Numbers 14:5 Then Moses and Aaron fell on their faces before all the assembly of the congregation of the children of Israel.

Numbers 14:17–19 And now, I beseech thee, let the power of my Lord be great, according as thou hast spoken, saying, The LORD is longsuffering, and of great mercy, forgiving iniquity and transgression, and by no means clearing the guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation. Pardon, I beseech thee, the iniquity of this people according unto the greatness of thy mercy, and as thou hast forgiven this people, from Egypt even until now.

Numbers 14:20–23

And the LORD said, I have pardoned according to thy word: But as truly as I live, all the earth shall be filled with the glory of the LORD. Because all those men which have seen my glory, and my miracles, which I did in Egypt and in the wilderness, and have tempted me now these ten times, and have not hearkened to my voice; Surely they shall not see the land which I sware unto their fathers, neither shall any of them that provoked me see it:

Numbers 14:28–30

Say unto them, As truly as I live, saith the LORD, as ye have spoken in mine ears, so will I do to you: Your carcases shall fall in this wilderness; and all that were numbered of you, according to your whole number, from twenty years old and **upward**, which have murmured against me, Doubtless ye shall not come into the land, concerning which I sware to make you dwell therein, save Caleb the son of Jephunneh, and Joshua the son of Nun.

Numbers 14:31-34 But your little ones, which ye said should be a prey, them will I bring in, and they shall know the land which ye have despised. But as for you, your carcases, they shall fall in this wilderness. And your children shall wander in the wilderness forty years, and bear your whoredoms, until your carcases be wasted in the wilderness. After the number of the days in which ye searched the land, even forty days, each day for a year, shall ye bear your iniquities, even forty years, and ye shall know my breach of promise.

Numbers 14:39-42

And Moses told these sayings unto all the children of Israel: and the people mourned greatly. And they rose up early in the morning, and gat them up into the top of the mountain, saying, Lo, we be here, and will go up unto the place which the LORD hath promised: for we have sinned. And Moses said, Wherefore now do ye transgress the commandment of the LORD? but it shall not prosper. Go not up, for the LORD is not among you; that ye be not smitten before your enemies.



Exodus 12:37-38

And the children of Israel **journeyed from Rameses to Succoth**, about six hundred thousand on foot that were men, beside children. And a mixed multitude went up also with them; and flocks, and herds, even very much cattle.

Numbers 33:3

And they departed from **Rameses in the first month, on the fifteenth day of the first month**; on the morrow after the passover the children of Israel went out with an high hand in the sight of all the Egyptians.



Exodus 16:1

And they took their journey from Elim, and all the congregation of the children of Israel came unto the wilderness of Sin, which is between Elim and Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the second month after their departing out of the land of Egypt.



Exodus 19:1

In the third month, when the children of Israel were gone forth out of the land of Egypt, the same day came they into the wilderness of Sinai.



Exodus 40:17–19

And it came to pass in the **first month in the** second year, on the first day of the month, that the tabernacle was reared up. And Moses reared up the tabernacle, and fastened his sockets, and set up the boards thereof, and put in the bars thereof, and reared up his pillars. And he spread abroad the tent over the tabernacle, and put the covering of the tent above upon it; as the LORD commanded Moses.



Numbers 9:1–5 And the LORD spake unto Moses in the wilderness of Sinai, in the first month of the second year after they were come out of the land of Egypt, saying, Let the children of Israel also keep the passover at his appointed season. In the fourteenth day of this month, at even, ye shall keep it in his appointed season: according to all the rites of it, and according to all the ceremonies thereof, shall ye keep it. And Moses spake unto the children of Israel, that they should keep the passover. And they kept the passover on the fourteenth day of the first month at even in the wilderness of Sinai: according to all that the LORD commanded Moses, so did the children of Israel.



Numbers 1:1–2

And the LORD spake unto Moses in the wilderness of Sinai, in the tabernacle of the congregation, on the first day of the second month, in the second year after they were come out of the land of Egypt, saying, Take ye the sum of all the congregation of the children of Israel, after their families, by the house of their fathers, with the number of their names, every male by their polls;



Numbers 10:11–13

And it came to pass on the twentieth day of the second month, in the second year, that the cloud was taken up from off the tabernacle of the testimony. And the children of Israel took their journeys out of the wilderness of Sinai; and the cloud rested in the wilderness of Paran. And they first took their journey according to the commandment of the LORD by the hand of Moses.



Leviticus 1:1

And the LORD called unto Moses, and **spake unto him out of the tabernacle of the congregation**, saying,

Leviticus 25:1

And the LORD spake unto Moses in mount Sinai, saying,



Numbers 20:28 And Moses stripped Aaron of his garments, and put them upon Eleazar his son; and Aaron died there in the top of the mount: and Moses and Eleazar came down from the mount.

Numbers 33:38–39 And Aaron the priest went up into mount Hor at the commandment of the LORD, and died there, in the fortieth year after the children of Israel were come out of the land of Egypt, in the first day of the fifth month. And Aaron was an hundred and twenty and three years old when he died in moust Horay 1

Deuteronomy 1:1–3 These be the words which Moses spake unto all Israel on this side Jordan in the wilderness, in the plain over against the Red sea, between Paran, and Tophel, and Laban, and Hazeroth, and Dizahab. (There are eleven davs' journey from Horeb by the way of mount Seir unto Kadeshbarnea.) And it came to pass in the fortieth year, in the eleventh month, on the first day of the month, that Moses spake unto the children of Israel, according unto all that the LORD had given him in commandment unto



Joshua 4:19 And the people came up out of Jordan on the **tene ay of the first month**, and encamped in Gilgal, in the past horder of Jericho.

Joshua 5:9–12 And the LORD sid unto Joshua, This day have I rolled a vay the reproach of Egypt from off our Wherefore the name of the place is called Orgal unto the start of the children of Israel encamped in Gilgal, and kept the passover on the fearted of Jaricho.

Deuteronomy 2:14

And the space in which we came from **Kadeshbarnea**, until we were come over the brook **Zered**, was **thirty and eight years**; until all the generation of the men of war were wasted out from among the host, as the LORD sware unto them.



Exodus 17:1

And all the congregation of the children of Israel journeyed from the wilderness of Sin, after their journeys, according to the commandment of the LORD, and pitched in **Rephidim**: and there was no water for the people to drink.

Exodus 17:6–7

Behold, I will stand before thee there upon the rock in Horeb; and thou shalt **smite the rock**, and there shall come water out of it, that the people may drink. And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel. And he called the name of the place Massah, and **Meribah**, because of the **chiding of the children** of Israel, and because they tempted the LORD, saying, Is the LORD among us, or not?

Numbers 20:1a–2

...and the people abode in **Kadesh**; and Miriam died there, and was buried there. And there was no water for the congregation: and they gathered themselves together against Moses and against Aaron.

Numbers 20:10–11

And Moses and Aaron gathered the congregation together before the rock, and he said unto them, Hear now, ye rebels; must we fetch you water out of this rock? And Moses lifted up his hand, and with his rod **he smote the rock** twice: and the **water came out abundantly**, and the congregation drank, and their beasts also.

Numbers 20:13a

This is the **water of Meribah**; because the children of Israel strove with the LORD...

Deuteronomy 32:51–52

Because ye [Moses] trespassed against me among the children of Israel at the waters of **Meribah-Kadesh**, in the wilderness of Zin; because ye sanctified me not in the midst of the children of Israel. Yet thou shalt see the land before thee; but **thou shalt not go thither** unto the land which I give the children of Israel.



Numbers 20:12

And the LORD spake unto Moses **and** Aaron, **Because ye believed me not**, to sanctify me in the eyes of the children of Israel, therefore ye shall not bring this congregation into the land which I have given them.

Numbers 20:24

Aaron shall be gathered unto his people: for he shall not enter into the land which I have given unto the children of Israel, **because ye rebelled** against my word at the water of Meribah.

Deuteronomy 3:23–27 And I besought the LORD at that time, saying, O Lord GOD, thou hast begun to shew thy servant thy greatness, and thy mighty hand: for what God is there in heaven or in earth, that can do according to thy works, and according to thy might? I pray thee, let me go over, and see the good land that is beyond Jordan, that goodly mountain, and Lebanon. But the LORD was wroth with me for your sakes, and would not hear me: and the LORD said unto me, Let it suffice thee; speak no more unto me of this matter. Get thee up into the top of Pisgah, and lift up thine eyes westward, and northward, and southward, and eastward, and behold it with thine eyes: for thou shalt not go over this Jordan.

Numbers 15:24a Then it shall be, if ought be committed by **ignorance** without the knowledge of the **congregation**, that all the congregation shall offer...

Numbers 15:27 And if any soul sin through ignorance, then he shall bring a she goat of the first year for a sin offering.

Numbers 15:30–31 But the soul that doeth ought presumptuously, whether he be born in the land, or a stranger, the same reproacheth the LORD; and that soul shall be cut off from among his people. Because he hath despised the word of the LORD, and hath broken his commandment, that soul shall utterly be cut off; his iniquity shall be upon him.

Deuteronomy 2:7

For the LORD thy God hath **blessed thee in all the works of thy hand**: he knoweth thy walking through this great wilderness: these forty years **the LORD thy God hath been with thee**; thou hast **lacked nothing**.



Deuteronomy 8:16

Who fed thee in the wilderness with manna, which thy fathers knew not, that he might humble thee, and that he might prove thee, **to do thee good at thy latter end;**

Deuteronomy 32:29

O that they were wise, that they understood this, that they would **consider their latter end**!



1 Corinthians 10:11–13

Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come. Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall. There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it.

1 Peter 2:11

Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, **abstain from fleshly lusts**, which war **against the soul**;

1 Peter 2:15–16

For so is **the will of God**, that with well doing ye may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men: **As free**, and not using your **liberty for a cloke of maliciousness**, but as the servants of God.
