SCRIBES = Onesimus & Paul (See Phm 19 & 25)

THE TIME AND PLACE OF WRITING = From Roman prison at the same timing as the letter to the Colossians (See verses Phm 1, 10, 13 & 23; Col 4:18). Most likely the timing mentioned in Ac 28:30-31




- **Colossians 4:6** Let your speech *be* alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man.

- MARK= JOHN MARK the cousin of Barnabas. Paul and Barnabus parted ways over Paul's concern over Mark not putting his hand to the plow with them in the work of the gospel ... but later apparently reconciled and Mark is endeared to Paul as another Son.
- Acts 12:12 And when he had considered the thing, he came to the house of Mary the mother of John, whose surname was Mark; where many were gathered together praying.
- Acts 12:25 And Barnabas and Saul returned from Jerusalem, when they had fulfilled their ministry, and took with them John, whose surname was Mark.
- Acts 15:37 And Barnabas determined to take with them John, whose surname was Mark. Acts 15:38-39 But Paul thought not good to take him with them, who departed from them from Pamphylia, and went not with them to the work. Acts 15:39 And the contention was so sharp between them, that they departed asunder one from the other: and so Barnabas took Mark, and sailed unto Cyprus;

Romans 5:8-10 But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him. For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.

Romans 5:1-2 Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.





Romans 4:24-25 But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead; Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification.
