What IS this Day of Trumpets?

The Bible does not list any special practices for the holiday beyond blowing trumpets and sacrificing some animals...No specific reason is given for the blowing of the trumpets, nor are we told what we are supposed to remember.

In Europe, during the High Middle Ages, the consumption of honey evolved into eating challah and fruit, which today has become almost universally apples dipped in honey. A new tradition of eating pomegranates on Rosh Hashanah arose at about the same time, based on the false belief that the number of seeds in a pomegranate is 613, the same as the number of Jewish commandments. Tashlikh, emptying one's pockets into the sea or river (or, when these aren't accessible, a well) on Rosh Hashanah is first mentioned in the 15th century and is now a common tradition among observant Jews. This is supposed to symbolize the clearing of oneself of sin.

Rosh Hashanah??

ROSH HA-SHANAH, the Jewish New Year, the autumn festival celebrated on the first and second days of Tishri.

In the Bible. The name Rosh Ha-Shanah as it is used in the Bible (Ezek. 40:1) simply means the beginning of the year, and does not designate the festival. The months of the year were counted from the spring month (Ex. 12:2), later called by the Babylonian name Nisan. The month known by the Babylonian name Tishri is, therefore, called the "seventh month" in the Pentateuch. When the festival on the first of this month is recorded, it is referred to as the festival of the seventh month and a day of "memorial proclaimed with the blast of horns," or "a day of blowing the horn" (Lev. 23:23-25; Num. 29:1-6). In the Bible, the festival lasts one day only; the two-day festival arose out of the difficulty of determining when the new moon actually appeared.

The liturgy of the holiday, that is the prayers added to the regular daily prayer, prescribed during this rabbinic age, deals with three main themes: The kingship of God, which is borrowed from the Babylonian Akidu where kingship (of the king) was a major theme; recital of God's great deeds; and blowing a musical instrument. At least the latter two were taken from the bible.

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Sound the Shofar?











Many erroneously associate nearly any mention of 'trumpets' in Scripture with this Feast day

Sound the Shofar?



On the first day of the seventh month hold a worship festival. It will be a memorial day, a holy assembly announced by the blowing of rams' horns. (GW)

Regarding that musical instrument, technically, the Bible doesn't say what exactly is to be blown. It is the Mishnah that first tells us this should be a shofar, a horn, usually of a ram, though it could alternatively come from an antelope or other horned beast.

Well before the Talmud was redacted in 500 CE, a variety of traditions regarding exactly how and when the Shofar was to be blown arose in the different Jewish communities. Not knowing which was correct, the rabbis decided that all the different traditions should be incorporated. Thus on Rosh Hashanah we have the T'qiah (a long blow), the sh'varim (three consecutive blows), and the teruah (nine fast blasts separated into three groups of three), all blown in different sequences at different stages of the day. These added up to 90 blasts, which were rounded up to the 100 blown today.

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What IS this Day of Trumpets?



Nehemiah 8:1-13

Ezra 3:1-3 And when the seventh month was come, and the children of Israel were in the cities, the people gathered themselves together as one man to Jerusalem. Then stood up Jeshua the son of Jozadak, and his brethren the priests, and Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, and his brethren, and builded the altar of the God of Israel, to offer burnt offerings thereon, as it is written in the law of Moses the man of God. And they set the altar upon his bases; for fear was upon them because of the people of those countries: and they offered burnt offerings thereon unto the LORD, even burnt offerings morning and evening.

Ezra 3:4-6 They kept also the Feast of Tabernacles, as it is written, and offered the daily burnt offerings by number, according to the custom, as the duty of every day required; And afterward offered the continual burnt offering, both of the new moons, and of all the set feasts of the LORD that were consecrated, and of every one that willingly offered a freewill offering unto the LORD. From the first day of the seventh month began they to offer burnt offerings unto the LORD. But the foundation of the temple of the LORD was not yet laid.

Observance In Scripture

And Ezra the priest brought the Law before the congregation both of men and women, and all that could hear with understanding, upon the first day of the seventh month. And he read therein before the street that was before the water gate from the morning until midday, before the men and the women, and those that could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive unto the book of the Law.

Where is this taught in ancient Judaic sources?

The Mishnah? It's not there.

No, it's not in Tractate Rosh HaShanah.

The Targums? Nope.

How about Josephus? Not so.

Philo Judaeus? Not here either.

That Day and Hour Knoweth No Man

Matthew 24:36-39 But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only. But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

Matthew 24:42-44 Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come. The Silver Trumpets

Numbers 10:2 Make thee two trumpets of silver; of a whole piece shalt thou make them: that thou mayest use them for the calling of the assembly, and for the journeying of the camps.



Numbers 10:3-9 And when they shall **blow** [taqa'] with them, all the assembly shall assemble themselves to thee at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation. And if they **blow** [taqa'] but with one trumpet, then the princes, which are heads of the thousands of Israel, shall gather themselves unto thee. When ye blow [taga'] an alarm [teruah], then the camps that lie on the east parts shall go forward. When ye **blow** [taga'] an alarm [teruah] the second time, then the camps that lie on the south side shall take their journey: they shall **blow** [taga'] an alarm [teruah] for their journeys. But when the congregation is to be gathered together, ye shall blow [taga'], but ye shall not sound an alarm [ruwa]. And the sons of Aaron, the priests, shall **blow** [taga'] with the trumpets; and they shall be to you for an ordinance for ever throughout your generations. And if ye go to war in your land against the enemy that oppresseth you, then ye shall **blow** [taqa'] an alarm [ruwa] with the trumpets; and ye shall be **remembered** [zakar] before the LORD your God, and ye shall be saved from your enemies.

Trumpets of War!

Numbers 31:6-7 And Moses sent them to the war, a thousand of every tribe, them and Phinehas the son of Eleazar the priest, to the war, with the holy instruments, and the trumpets to **blow** [teruah] in his hand. And they warred against the Midianites, as the LORD commanded Moses; and they slew all the males.

Shofar, Teruah, & War

Joshua 6:5 ...when ye hear the sound of the trumpet [shofar], all the people shall **shout** [ruah] with a **great shout** [teruah] ...

Job 39:25 He [the horse] saith among the **trumpets** [shofar], Ha, ha; and he smelleth the battle afar off, the thunder of the captains, and the **shouting** [teruah].

Jeremiah 4:19 ...thou hast heard, O my soul, the sound of the trumpet [shofar], the alarm [teruah] of war.

- Alarm blasts were sounded in times of war.
- At the **Feasts**, the **Sabbath** and the **New Moons**. The Scripture does not indicate that these are alarms/teruah blasts.

Assembling The Saints At His Return

Matthew 24:30-31 And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. And He shall send His angels with a great sound of a trumpet, and they shall gather together His elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.

No Alarm For Assembly

Numbers 10:7 But when the congregation is to be gathered together, you shall blow, but you shall not sound an alarm.

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The Sound Of The Trumpet

"The blowing of trumpets represented the preaching of the gospel, by which men are called to repent of sin, and to accept the salvation of Christ, which was signified by the Day of Atonement. Also it invited to rejoice in God, and become strangers and pilgrims on earth, which was denoted by the feast of Tabernacles, observed in the same month."

The Sound Of The Trumpet

"they were called by this sound of trumpet to shake off spiritual drowsiness, to search and try their ways, and to amend them. The Day of Atonement was the ninth day after this; thus they were awakened to prepare for that day, by sincere and serious repentance, that it might indeed be to them a Day of Atonement. The humbling of our souls for sin, and the making our peace with God, is work that requires the whole man, and the closest application of mind."

"These trumpets typify the preached gospel. It sounds an alarm to sinners, calls them to repent, proclaims liberty to the captives and slaves of Satan, and collects the worshippers of God. It directs and encourages their heavenly journey; stirs them up to combat against the world and sin, encouraging them with the assurance of victory. It leads their attention to the sacrifice of Christ, and shows the Lord's presence for their protection. It is also necessary that the gospel trumpet give a distinct sound, according to the persons addressed, or the end proposed; whether to convince, humble, console, exhort, reprove, or teach."
