



Empiricism is the philosophy that knowledge is based solely on what can be confirmed with the senses.

This view is aligned to the scientific method and the requirement that a hypothesis be tested with observation and measurement. The scientific method further specifies that knowledge is probabilistic, falsifiable and subject to continuing challenge.





Empiricism requires knowledge be...

...and subject to continuing challenge: always ready to be tested and adapted if new evidence is presented.

...falsifiable:

A statement, hypothesis or theory is **falsifiable** if it can be contradicted by an observation or test. If such is impossible to make, **falsifiability is not achieved.**





Empiricism

A challengeable, falsifiable example

Joe said Sally took the last donut.

There were eight other witnesses that also saw Sally take the last donut.

This can be tested by interviewing of the witnesses.

If they are proven false, the 'fact' can be proven false (falsified).





Empiricism

An unchallengeable, unfalsifiable example

A small teapot orbiting the Sun that is too small to be seen with telescopes.

No one has ever seen this teapot

No one will ever be able to see it

This statement cannot be challenged or proven false; thus it is **unfalsifiable**.



Most scholars believe Hinduism started somewhere between 2300 B.C. and 1500 B.C. in the Indus Valley, near modern-day Pakistan. Hinduism has no one founder but is instead a fusion of various beliefs.

Around 1500 B.C., the Indo-Aryan people migrated to the Indus Valley, and their language and culture blended with that of the indigenous people living in the region – Hinduism grew out of this 'melting-pot'.



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Buddhism

Siddhartha Gautama, the founder of Buddhism who later became known as "the Buddha," lived during the 5th century B.C.

Gautama was born into a wealthy family as a prince in present-day Nepal. Although he had an easy life, Gautama was moved by suffering in the world. He decided to give up his lavish lifestyle and endure poverty. When this didn't fulfill him, he promoted the idea of the "Middle Way," which means existing between two extremes. Thus, he sought a life without social indulgences but also without deprivation.

After six years of searching, Buddhists believe Gautama found enlightenment while meditating. He spent the rest of his life teaching others about how to achieve this spiritual state.

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Islam

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According to Muslim scholars, these recitations were written down into what has become the Quran (Koran) after Muhammed died in 632 AD.

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Scientology

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Dianetics: The Modern Science of Mental Health - Published on May 9th, 1950, sparked a storm of popular enthusiasm. Thereafter, L. Ron Hubbard delved ever deeper into the spiritual nature of Man, documenting his discoveries in thousands of recorded lectures, films, articles and books.



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Mormonism

When Joseph Smith was 14, he said he received a vision from God and Jesus that told him not to join any Christian denominational churches. Three years later, Smith claimed that an angel named Moroni appeared to him. Moroni revealed that Smith had been selected to translate the Book of Mormon, a sacred text that was written around the 4th century and named after Moroni's father, Mormon (yes, angels have fathers according to J.S.).

In 1823 Moroni revealed that the book was inscribed on golden plates near Palmyra, New York. The Book of Mormon was first published in 1830.

Smith also asserted that John the Baptist appeared to him while he was translating the Book of Mormon and instructed him to restore the church by preaching the true gospel. 16

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Jehovah's Witnesses

The sect now known as the Jehovah's Witnesses was started by Charles Taze Russell in 1879. He was raised a Congregationalist, but at the age of 17 he tried to convert an atheist to Christianity and ended up being converted instead—not to outright atheism, but to agnosticism. Some years later he went to an Adventist meeting, was told that Jesus would be back at any time and started developing his doctrines – doctrines that he said would lead followers back to true 1st century Christianity. He wanted to restore the church by preaching the true gospel.



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Christian Scientists

The Church of Christ (Scientist) was founded in New England by Mary Baker Eddy, who wrote the 1875 book *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures*, which outlined the theology of Christian Science. The book became Christian Science's central text.

Eddy described Christian Science as a return to "primitive Christianity and its lost element of healing" This was revealed to her over a period of years by what she described as a series of "falling apples".

Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.



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




