

Confidence in a future event; the highest degree of well founded **expectation of good**; as a hope founded on God's gracious promises;



1 Kings 19:14




Jeremiah 29:11

A wrong focus destroys hope.

Lamentations 3:18–20

And I said, My strength and **my hope is perished** from the LORD: **Remembering mine affliction and my misery, the wormwood and the gall**. My soul hath them still in remembrance, and is humbled in me.

Psalm 73:2–3

But as for me, **my feet were almost gone**; my steps had well nigh slipped. For **I was envious at the foolish,** when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.



Postponed hope makes the heart sick.

Proverbs 13:12a

Hope deferred makes the heart sick

2 Corinthians 12:8–9

For this thing [thorn in flesh] I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.



Unfailing hope is found in God alone.

Psalm 28:7–8

The LORD is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in him, and I am helped: therefore my heart greatly rejoiceth; and with my song will I praise him. The LORD is their strength, and he is the saving strength of his anointed.

Psalm 33:20–22

Our soul waiteth for the LORD: **he is our help and our shield**. For our heart shall rejoice in him, because we have trusted in his holy name. Let thy mercy, O LORD, be upon us, **according as we hope in thee**.

Faithful perseverance strengthens hope.

Romans 5:3-5

And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces <u>perseverance</u>; and perseverance, <u>character</u>; and character, **hope**. Now hope does not disappoint, because **the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit** who was given to us.





Hope is one of God's specialties

Titus 3:4–7

But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost; Which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour; That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the **hope of eternal life**.





The offer of Hope isn't just for the lost

Luke 4:18

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,



God can do much more than we can imagine.

Ephesians 3:20 (ESV)

Now to him who is able to do **far more abundantly** than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us,

2 Corinthians 9:8 (ESV)

And God **is able** to make all grace abound to you, so that **having all sufficiency in all things at all times**, you may abound in every good work.



Recalling God's faithfulness restores lost hope.

Lamentations 3:21–23

This I recall to my mind, therefore have I hope. It is of **the LORD'S mercies** that we are not consumed, because **his compassions fail not**. They are **new every morning**: great is thy faithfulness.



Recalling God's faithfulness restores lost hope. Psalm 40:1–3

I waited patiently for the LORD; and he inclined unto me, and heard my cry. He brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings. And he hath put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the LORD.



Recalling God's faithfulness restores lost hope.

- He forgives all your sins.
- He heals all your diseases.
- He redeems your life from destruction.
- He crowns you with lovingkindness and tender mercies.
- He sets you free.
- He makes known His ways to you.
- He gives you His grace and mercy in times of need.



Recalling God's faithfulness restores lost hope. Philippians 4:7–9

And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things. Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you. 45

2 Peter 3:11–14

Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness, Looking for and hasting unto the coming of the day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat? Nevertheless we, according to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness. Wherefore, beloved, seeing that ye look for such things, be diligent that ye may be found of him in peace, without spot, and blameless.





Romans 15:13

Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost.
