






Jeremiah 17:5–6

Transcendentalism







Acts 3:6

20

Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk.

Acts 3:12–13a

And when Peter saw it, he answered unto the people, Ye men of Israel, why marvel ye at this? or why look ye so earnestly on us, as though by our own power or holiness we had made this man to walk? **The God** of Abraham, and of Isaac, and of Jacob, the God of our fathers, **hath glorified his Son Jesus**;





Jonathan Edwards wrote in the 1730's.

He called pride "the worst viper that is in the heart" and the greatest "disturber of the soul's peace and sweet communion with Christ." He ranked pride as the most difficult sin to root out, and "the most hidden, secret, and deceitful of all lusts."





 Do I feel superior to others instead of feeling humbled before God?

23

- For example, do I look with contempt at those who I think are 'lazy' and assume they need to work harder to get out of their misery?
 - More likely they would be better served by the same spirit that inhabited Job – to either give them the grace to endure or the ability to rise above as the Lord's will would be.
- For example, do I look in my heart and find a sense of superiority over others, rather than a deep sense of humility before God, that would show a pocket of pride.



- Do I find pleasure in people noticing me, rather than in people exalting in Christ?
 - For example, leaving a conversation and thinking, I really told that story well. I made them laugh, instead of, Oh Lord, did I leave that conversation exalting you?
- Do I become jealous when others are noticed more than me?

- Am I more aware of someone else's sinfulness than my own? Whose sinfulness are you the most aware of?
- We all should be more keenly aware of our own sin than the sin of others.
- Am I prone to believe the best about myself and the worst about others.

SELF-RELIANCE



- Do I talk about what exalts me instead of talking about what helps others?
- Am I angry about my rights and what I think I deserve?
- Do I hate sin because it makes me look bad, not because it dishonors Christ?
